"Welcoming and accepting all people" – is a reminder of our Welcome Statement and genuine hospitality, in the present tense so it is always relevant. "along" – is an invitation to join together side by side. "journey of faith" – implies that arrival is a myth; we are always growing. "service" – is a natural outcome of faith and inseparable from our commitment to discipleship.

FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

After a very trying month of funerals which have rocked our congregation, I am looking forward to the celebration of Easter, which gives me hope in the face of death as I am certain it has for generations of those who follow our Risen Christ. The Easter event dramatically changed the way people viewed the actions and teachings of Jesus and forever changed the course of history for much of the world. *The One who Was and Is and Is to Come* is still changing lives, and we are a living testimony to that power of transformation.

I invite you to continue reflecting with me on the various understandings of Jesus in the remaining weeks of Lent, and especially on Maundy Thursday and Easter morning. On Maundy Thursday we will have a service at 6:30 p.m. to recall the Last Supper and a revised Tenebrae service based on Jesus as Light and Salvation. Our chancel choir is providing leadership to this service in lieu of an Easter cantata.

On Easter morning we will have a sunrise service at 6:30 a.m., beginning in the chapel and progressing to the gazebo in Friendship Park. This simple service will symbolically engage attendees in the progression from the darkness of the tomb to the living presence of the risen Christ in the garden as the light of dawn grows.

A potluck breakfast will follow at 8:30 in Fellowship Hall, and everyone is asked to bring a breakfast dish to share. Drinks will be provided, and a craft activity will be provided for children to make and take with them to help recall and tell the Easter story. Sunday School classes will take place at the usual time of 9:30 a.m. for all ages.

The morning worship service at 10:45 will include the flowering of the cross as worshippers are invited to bring fresh or synthetic flowers to place on the cross during our prayer time in celebration of the transformation of our sorrow into joy and our gratitude for God's grace and power. The Easter Offering for the General Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) will be received, and our sanctuary will be adorned as customary with blooming lilies in memory and honor of loved ones. (See instructions elsewhere in the newsletter if you wish to sponsor one or more lilies.) My final sermon in the series *The One who Was and Is and Is to Come* will highlight Jesus as "Lord," and challenge us to reorient our lives in meaningful ways as we journey beyond the empty tomb in obedience and faith.

Mission Trip "Spring Fever" Super Sale Event: Our Mission Team is looking forward to our big "Super Sale Event" fundraiser on **April 29** and we need your help. Parking lot spaces are available for \$30.00 (\$25.00 for the first five to sign up). Applications may also be obtained from the church office. If you can help us with the publicity by taking posters or flyers to distribute around the community please ask Pastor Kathryn for them.

And last but not least we need volunteers and more volunteers to help with the sale on the day of the event and prior to the event. There are a multitude of tasks that need to be done and the Mission Team cannot do them all. Treasurer: Financial report for January and February reports noting some information lacking or incorrect due to computer issues; Treasurers continue to work to get all information correctly reflected.
