REACHING OUT TO OUR NEIGHBORS WITH REV. KATHRYN WILSON, MINISTER OF MISSION AND OUTREACH

Alternative Christmas Fair: Many thanks to everyone in our congregation and the Joplin community for supporting our 5th Annual Alternative Christmas Fair. It was a great success. The crowd visiting and shopping was consistent throughout the weekend which was a real plus. No bad weather or street construction to contend with as in the past. Our net sales for Ten Thousand Villages were \$2746 almost doubling our sales in the past three years and would you believe we sold a little over \$700 in Equal Exchange products. We will continue to stand with and support the vision and mission of Ten Thousand Villages and Equal Exchange – believing that "One day all artisans and farmers in developing countries will earn a fair wage, be treated with dignity and respect and be able to live a life of quality." Additionally, Outreach raised \$511.00 through the Chili Feed. Once all expenses are paid a full report will be filed. All proceeds from this event will continue to fund our Outreach ministries. May the peace and love of God be with you in the New Year.

Bright Futures/Irving Elementary: Our First Friday Readers are a mighty awesome group of volunteers. Thank you so much for your service. Due to our Christmas Fair some of our regular readers were unavailable but SJCC was still well represented. In January 2017 our First Friday Reading Day will be on the second Friday, January 13, 1:00 pm – 2:30 pm. Please contact Pastor Kathryn no later than Wednesday, January 11 of your desire to read.

At our last Site Council meeting it was announced that there would not be an Art Fair this school year. The proceeds in the past helped to offset the cost of Irving's College Bound Program. Due to the cost of this program, a decision was made by the school's administrative staff to withdraw Irving's participation. In lieu of this program Principal Mwangi reported that the students, especially 4th and 5th grades will participate in education and enrichment field trips. The Site Council will begin exploring a new fundraising idea to help fund this initiative.

In December Irving added a fifth 2nd grade class due to increased numbers. We would like to welcome Ms. Hamilton, the new 2nd grade teacher. The Project Lab has been converted into a classroom to accommodate the new addition.

Ms. Michele Voorhees, our Irving counselor, has started a new "Career Days" program for the 4th and 5th grades to enlighten them of the many career paths that they may choose to pursue in the future. If you would be interested in being a "Career Day" speaker please contact Ms. Voorhees at 417-625-5350. As a result of parent requests for tutors, Mrs. Mwangi and her staff are exploring the expansion of Irving's TREK program to include tutors in addition to the regular TREK coaches. If you would be interested in volunteering with this tutoring program please contact Pastor Kathryn. **Mental Health Task Group:** At the end of the summer several members of the congregation formed a Mental Health Task Group to begin exploring ways in which our congregation can be a catalyst in dismantling the stigma as relates to mental health and mental illness through education and awareness. The group has been in conversation with Rick Wiseman, director of Joplin's NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) organization to learn how SJCC can begin to better understand more about mental illness as well as promote education and awareness in the community. NAMI recently relocated into our neighborhood at 1601 S. Wall. In collaboration with NAMI, SJCC will host the NAMI Family-to-Family Education Program on Thursdays, beginning February 2 (6:30 p.m. – 9:00 p.m.). This 12 weeks program is free and is for family, partners, friends and significant others of adults living with mental illness. The maximum capacity is 20. The registration deadline is January 21. For more information and to register contact NAMI at 417-781-6264.

Crosslines: A lot is happening these days to improve and expand the services at Crosslines. A hardy welcome is extended to the newly hired Interim Program Coordinator, Julia Lewis. She will be overseeing the development of new services and redesigning of some of the current services. We also welcome Annalise Bye, a MSSU Social Work Program student who has joined the staff to lead training for both staff and volunteers, who led the recent 5th Wednesday Volunteer Training and Appreciation. The workshop was entitled, "Why We Serve and How to Help." Under the restructure the Assistant Director position is being eliminated with plans to hire a Director of Programming next year, and add two paid positions – Office Coordinator and Floater (10 -15 hrs. a week). Current needs include: Volunteer Gate Keeper for Donations Room, Volunteer Receptionist and Volunteer Truck Driver. If you are interested in any of these positions or can suggest someone please contact Julia at Crosslines, 417-782-8384.

Come join with Crosslines on March 20, 2017 @ 2:30 pm – for the "320 Event" to dedicate the building and celebrate the 35th Anniversary. It is hoped that enough people will attend and participate in order to encircle the entire facility for a time of prayer and song followed by refreshments. So please mark your calendars now and plan to be there. Plans are also underway for a 2017 Volunteer Appreciation Banquet which has not happened during the past two years. The chairperson of the Volunteer Appreciation Committee is looking for several people to help plan this event. As the hours have been expanded to accommodate late hours on the first Mondays, groups or individuals are needed to staff the first Monday evening hours 5:30-7:00. The next JO-MO Restaurant Week is the last week in January.

Souper Bowl of Caring: It's time again South Joplin for the Big Challenge of the year. It's time for the Souper Bowl of Caring! Rah! Rah! Go Team Go! Are you up for the challenge? On Sunday, January 15 we will kick off our annual Souper Bowl Campaign to help tackle hunger in the Joplin community. Once again we will divide our congregation into two teams, Team North and Team South (teams are based on the side of the sanctuary where you sit on Sunday mornings). Beginning January 16 through February 5 we will be collecting cans of soup and crackers for the Crosslines Food Pantry. If you remember last year the youth led this friendly competition between Team North and Team South. Collection boxes will be clearly marked North and South. Last year we received 467 food items/423 lbs. and cash donations of \$140.00. I challenge you to exceed last year's collection. Did you know that 1 in 7 Americans face hunger every day?

2017 SJCC Mission Trip: Plans for our mission trip are underway. We are registered with Disciples Volunteering and scheduled to travel and work in Rowlett, TX June 4-10, 2017. Total registration cost is \$75.00 and additional amount for food and travel. The Team will be exploring fundraising options over the next several months to help offset the costs. Past Treasurer Sandy Meadows working on issue with IRS for past several months - IRS notified SJCC it hadn't rec'd forms from 2013 - IRS did find related documents, but showing in IRS files as status "Pending"; will continue working with IRS to settle issue.

<u>Financial Report</u> raised discussion regarding financial deficit over past few months; stressed importance of making congregation aware donations not covering costs of operation of church; suggestions include use of graphs to illustrate situation, taskforce to see cutting spending, spending freeze of all committees, potential fund raising activities for monies for the General Fund;

Pastor Kathryn planned/led youth Mission Mystery Tour; attended Police Community forum and will meet with JPD Chief Stewart and Glendola Flake (emancipation committee co-chair) to continue conversation about cultural awareness training.

CWF made donations to SJCC of \$916 (steps repair), \$916 (Crosslines), and \$916 (Sabbatical fund).

Green Team noted team will not pursue Green Chalice certification at this time.

Hospitality noted fellowship dinners well attended and self paying.

Permanent Fund pleased to note 2016 contributions received totaling \$4,387.56.

Property noted account balance of \$6,490.78 (note: 1910 Wall Nov/Dec rents received - not yet deposited); motion to accept Mid-West Concrete bid of \$7,263 to repair/refinish front porch and steps.

Worship stressed need for Children Worship & Wonder Story Tellers/Greeters; noted no committee chair established for 2017.

Youth working on tying blankets for Lafayette House and planning Youth Sunday.
