## FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

One never knows how much is simply coincidence and how much is movement in tandem with the Spirit of God, especially when it comes to Christian ministry. I try to listen to the Spirit when I plan worship and programmatic activities, and often I hear recurring themes or echoes that lead in the same direction. That's the birthplace of the theme I have chosen for Lent, which I am entitling, "The One Who Was, and Is, and Is to Come." It comes out of several readings and reflections of late which compare identities of Jesus as he may have been understood by his contemporaries and early followers with current recognitions and titles, and projections or outcomes for his followers as we live into the future. In the next seven weeks in worship and adult Sunday School, we will look at Jesus as Son of God, Teacher, Savior, Healer, Victor, King, and Lord, with this three-fold perspective of past, present, and future in mind.

Our worship will also combine some elements of past, present, and future. We will substitute the wooden cross and nails for the lighting of candles at prayer time, a practice we have embraced for the past few years. The elders will also be introducing a new practice of anointing with oil for those who wish to be anointed, for whatever purpose. The presiding elder will be available during prayer time to anoint with oil and offer a brief blessing without any need for explanation from the worshipper. We will sing familiar songs and hymns and learn a few new tunes. All our worship will rehearse the ancient stories of our faith, with the intent of continuing the journey into the present and future kin-dom of God. I look forward to our shared journey of faith this Lenten season, beginning on Ash Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. for the imposition of ashes. *Pastor Colleen*
