

### From Our Senior Minister

Last month I wrote about my excitement and anticipation in attending the General Assembly, and now I write with equal excitement having returned from the historic event. As I expected, it was a beautiful experience of diversity and inspiration, and I continue to be grateful to be afforded the opportunity to attend.



I have witnessed the transition of several General Minister and Presidents in the time since I began attending assemblies, and was delighted to be present for the installation of Rev. Teresa Hord Owens on the final evening of worship. As is customary in ordination and installation services, the worshipping community gathered around her and laid hands on her, stretching from her shoulders throughout the congregation. I was moved to be in that chain of support, praying with and for the Holy Spirit to anoint her in this monumental calling. I was also moved to listen to her first sermon to the assembly as GMP, and to hear her pledge to love God first, and love the church to the best of her ability. I immediately thought of the words of 1 Corinthians 13 that without love, our words and actions are but a noisy gong.

The timing of electing our first African American to this position is no accident. At this assembly we voted to recommit our support for Reconciliation Ministries which continues to struggle to meet the demands of its programs while being underfunded by the church, and we voted to become more knowledgeable of the historic merger agreement between the National Christian Missionary Convention (the organized body of African American churches in the Stone Campbell movement organized in 1917) with the International Convention of the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ) in 1968. I also wager we enjoyed greater leadership and participation on the part of African American Disciples in general at this assembly. The election of Rev. Owens is a reflection of our genuine commitment to reconciliation and a valuable step toward authentic unity, and I celebrate the growing diversity in our denomination, as I do here at home in Joplin.

In returning from the assembly, I thanked SJCC in my sermon on July 16 for all the hard work you have done in the past to make room for greater diversity in our fellowship. But our work is never finished. In order to have unity in the midst of diversity, we need to keep our hearts, minds, ears and hands constantly open to the leading of the Spirit, always keeping love as our highest ethic. May God continue to be before us as we embrace our mission of "loving and accepting all people along a journey of faith and service."

This is a quote that many have heard me use often as I challenge you to find ways to do service and bring forth God's kin-dom here on earth. Each day ask yourself, "how or where did I see God at work today?" Then ask, "how did I respond to God's grace today?" Just a reminder that there is much we can do to bring forth God's kin-dom in our world today.

### VBS Blessing Bags

It's not too late to donate items for our VBS mission project. The children will be making bags and filling them during VBS on Thursday, August 3. If you still want to help with donations to this project you may place your items in the blue buckets in the Narthex or in the Fellowship Hall. Our mission component this year is focusing on the issue of homelessness in our nation. Did you know that on average between 564,708 - 643,067 experience homelessness and being unsheltered in our country on any given night? Be informed about the plight of the unsheltered. There are many reasons or circumstances why people find themselves in this situation (loss of employment, health issues, domestic violence, mental illness, lack of sufficient income, etc.) The bags will be distributed to people in our community who find themselves in a transient/homeless/unsheltered situation. The revised list of items you can donate to fill the bags include: peanut butter or cheese crackers; small packs of Trail Mix; beef jerky, applesauce or fruit cups. Items most needed: bandanas; individual packs of (Kleenex) tissues; baby wipes or moist towelettes; socks (men's and women's); combs. We have an ample supply of trial/hotel size lotion; tooth brushes and toothpaste. You will find metal blue buckets for donated items in the Fellowship Hall and Narthex. ### **CWS Blanket Sunday**

For several years South Joplin has been an avid supporter of the Church World Service Blanket Sunday through an annual special offering.

We are once again partnering with Church World Service to provide blankets for families in need all around the world. From those affected by earthquakes, floods, and war, a CWS blanket will provide the warmth they need. It will also give them knowledge that they are not alone and that there is hope for recovery.

In 2016, CWS distributed over three thousand blankets in the U.S. and other places around the world. \$10.00 will purchase one blanket. This year we will receive this offering on Sunday August 6 and August 13.
