NEW CHURCH LOGO

After months of discussion and revisions, the Elders have approved a new logo for our church, and are excited to begin using it as another means of sharing the unique ministry we offer to the wider community. We worked once more with KM Guru Marketing of Joplin who designed and host our web page, in particular with a student intern named Makenzie, who was very gracious and patient through our numerous requests and revisions.

As you can see, the Disciple chalice is central to who we are as a congregation. We are now the only Disciples of Christ church in Joplin, and we remain committed to the covenantal relationship across the region and general church as part of the "movement for wholeness in a fragmented world." The second half of the Disciple's Identity Statement reminds us of the chalice and Table that have always been central to our ecclesiology: "As part of the one body of Christ, we welcome all to the Lord's Table, as God has welcomed us."

Surrounding the chalice is a circle of color representing community, inclusion, diversity, and energy. Yes, they are rainbow colors, and yes, that is an intentional nod of welcome to LGTBQ persons, but also to straight allies who embrace the values of inclusion that reach beyond sexual orientation or identity. We have witnessed an influx of persons to the church because of this intentional practice, validating the decision the church made several years ago to be a welcoming congregation. This will be a visible means of affirming that practice as we use our logo on various marketing tools and materials.

The church is now invited to help us determine the best ways to use the new logo to boost our congregational identity and outreach. Granted that our funds are limited, the introduction may need to be gradual. If you know of others in the marketing or media world who would be willing to offer services for minimal fees, please inform our elders or pastors.

Welcoming and accepting all people along a journey of faith and service.

"Welcoming and accepting all people" – is a reminder of our Welcome Statement and genuine hospitality, in the present tense so it is always relevant. "along" – is an invitation to join together side by side. *"journey of faith" – implies that arrival is a myth; we are always growing. "service" – is a natural* outcome of faith and inseparable from our commitment to discipleship.

From Our Senior Minister

Welcome back to our beloved Minister of Mission and Outreach, Pastor Kathryn! I'm certain I speak for everyone when I express deep appreciation for all she invests in our ministries and behalf of our congregation in the wider

community. Although she ensured that her responsibilities were primarily covered in her absence during her sabbatical, no one can replace her unique gifts, and especially for me, the camaraderie and mutuality that I have come to appreciate in our shared ministry. Thank you, SJCC, for affording her the time off, and for taking up many of her tasks so faithfully and enthusiastically. Remember that we were to be prayerfully considering our future together in mission, and what that might look like in the coming months and years. We will have opportunity to share our reflections very soon.

Our stewardship focus for the month of June may be one of the most difficult for me. The topic is stewardship of our possessions and property. I may very well be the modern protégé of the rich seeker who came to Jesus but went away in disappointment when Jesus told him to sell all he had in order to follow the Way. I hope you'll join me in serious (and perhaps humorous) reflection on our accumulation of material wealth, and prayerfully look for ways to bless God and others with faithful stewardship.
