From Our Senior Minister

The writer of Ecclesiastes would be in for serious reparations if he/she were eligible for royalties on the famous *“time for all seasons”* passage in the third chapter. The words have been set to many tunes, and in my lifetime, made popular by Pete Seeger’s recording of “Turn, Turn, Turn.” According to Wikipedia, the song was originally released in 1962 as “To Everything There Is a Season” on folk group the Limelites’ RCA album Folk Matinee and then some months later on Seeger’s own The Bitter and the Sweet. Many people who adored the song had no idea it came from Hebrew scripture.

During the month of May we turn, turn, turn our attention to the stewardship of time. We are almost half way through the year, and some may be asking, where has the time gone? The writer of Ecclesiastes claims there is a season for every matter under heaven, but does not claim, however, that there is enough time for everything! Like finances, time can become a scarce commodity. Yet it, too, is something we can value as a gift from God, with opportunity and responsibility for wise use toward God’s glory and pleasure. I hope you will set aside some time to reflect on your personal use of time, perhaps doing an audit of the percentage of time you exert on work, play, rest, and God. If it can be said that our checkbooks are a reflection of our financial priorities, perhaps our calendars are a reflection of our stewardship of time.

And while you’re at it, I hope you will recognize the value of spending time with your church family in worship, faith formation, fellowship, and service.

INTERFAITH UNDERSTANDING: WHAT IS RAMADAN?

Ramadan is a Muslim holiday; a time for spiritual purification achieved through fasting, self-sacrifice and prayers. It is celebrated during the ninth month of Islamic calendar (*this year Ramadan will begin at sundown on Tuesday, May 15*). The fast is observed each day from sunrise to sunset. Fasting during Ramadan is one of the five Pillars of Islam. The Islamic belief that requires that Muslims perform five central duties in order to strengthen their faith. Muslims aim to realize these five pillars in their lifetime. Ramadan concludes with a 3-day festival known as “Eid” or “Eid ul-Fitr,” which literally means “the feast of the breaking/to break the fast.” The holiday marks the end of Ramadan, the holy month of fasting and is a culmination of the month-long struggle towards a higher spiritual state. Crosslines is currently seeking additional volunteers for Monday, May 14 and 21 (4-7 pm), Tuesday, May 29, and Thursday, May 31 (9:45 am-2 pm). Please note, **Crosslines will be closed Monday, May 28 for Memorial Day and Wednesday, May 30 for the "Friend's of Crosslines" meeting.**

Crosslines Challenge for May will be a little different from our usual challenge. They are in need catsup, barbecue sauce, salt, pepper, and common spices. Let's try to collect 100 of these items. Many of them can be had for \$1.00 each - even the small containers of common spices are \$1 at the Dollar Tree.

Office needs: clear tape, sticky notes, and Avery labels (5160-30/page.) Pantry needs: sandwich-size Ziploc bags. Sorting room needs: masking tape. If you are willing to donate any of these, they can be placed on either the table in the basement or the cart in the narthex where the monthly food challenge is collected.

For distribution to clients, Crosslines needs inexpensive flip flops, small appliances, adult extra-large sized clothing, men's shoes and underwear, and feminine hygiene products. If you would like to donate, but the Crossline hours are not convenient for you, give your donations to Karen Kemp at church. She will be happy to convey your donations and return a tax receipt if you wish.

Classes

ADULT FAITH FORMATION Sunday at 9:30 a.m. Room A-11

During the month of May, we will be discussing The Souls of Poor Folk, a report auditing America 50 years after the Poor People's Campaign challenged racism, poverty, the war economy/ militarism, and our national morality. In 1967, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., alongside a multiracial coalition of grassroots leaders, religious leaders, and other public figures, began organizing with poor and marginalized communities across racial and geographic divides. Together, The Poor People's Campaign aimed to confront the underlying structures that perpetuated misery in their midst.

Fifty years later, The Souls of Poor Folk challenges us to take a look at how these conditions have changed since 1968. The stark findings draw from a wide variety of sources, including primary and secondary data as well as interviews with and testimonies by people who have been living through and responding to these changes on the ground.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

The children and youth meet each Sunday morning from 9:30 a.m. - 10:20 a.m. We work to encourage our young people in their walk of faith.

"Where It's At" is for those 3 years old through 4th grade and uses crafts, games, and songs centered around a particular Bible story each week. There is a more in-depth class with discussion for grades 5 - 12. Both classes meet on the third floor and parents are always welcome to attend with their students.

This quarter "Where It's At" students are studying the parables of Jesus. People often asked Him what He meant when He said "the Kingdom of God." Jesus told many parables explaining what God's Kingdom is like.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE APRIL 10 BOARD MEETING

Treasurer: noted it appeared expenses for March \$9,043.91 greater than income. Some expenses anticipated/paid from I&R with actual expenses \$937 over income (one Sunday missed due to weather.)

Pastor Colleen: excited by number of folks to attend “Chat & Chew”; met with Child Protection Task Force and working to set date for training session/background check for child/youth volunteers/workers; attended JoMoEq (local support group for LGBTQ individuals) meeting and was informed Joplin Pride Fest NOT likely to happen this summer; the Millards, Wheelers, Tom Hamm, and herself will all be attending Regional Assembly;

CWF: hosted guests from Regional Disciples Women; elected new officers for 2018-2019 fiscal year.

Faith Formation: continue to have low attendance for Sunday school; asked for suggestions on getting kids into Sunday school.

Green Team: continues to collect supplies for Humane Society; found another bike rack - to be ordered soon.

Outreach: noted Movie in the Park on June 22nd; asked that Outreach member assist with purchases from Equal Exchange cabinet; announced Easter special offering of \$1,167 received.

Property: Rental Account deposits current; reset basement elevator hallway light, cleaned/repared hot water heater in Narthex bathroom, lubed front doors, door stops reset; pleased tornado drill conducted with no problems, thanked all who participated/helped; explained all exterior doors to be locked after start of worship and ushers to be on duty to monitor for late comers (ushers responsible for securing building after services); **stressed need for additional volunteer ushers on rotating schedule.**

Youth: guest speaker in April to help kids understand DACA.

Old Business: motion passed to approve Camp Scholarship Fund Policy and include in SJCC Policy Manual.

New Business: motion passed approving Mark Millard, Betsy Wheeler, Tom Wheeler as voting delegates (Regional Assembly).
