#### Vacation Bible School News

Our plans for VBS this summer are a little like an old camp song: "Make new friends but keep the old." Having VBS one day a week during July seems to work, so the dates are July 10, 17, 24, and 31 from 9AM to 2PM. We provide a morning snack and a light lunch.

We will still take afternoon field trips to local agencies including Crosslines, but also visit Ronald McDonald House, Children's Haven, and National Health Care. Parents, if your child has afternoon activities or is too young to enjoy these visits, you may pick your child(ren) up early at 12 o'clock noon. We will be transporting the children in the church bus, which does not accommodate booster seats, so if you have concerns about their safety, you may join us at noon and provide your own transportation.

We have new curriculum from Global Ministries which utilizes Bible stories to teach the Fruit of the Spirit, but rather than going "back in time" to hear from biblical characters, we will sail in our imaginations to four Caribbean countries to become acquainted with new cultures and characters.

Instead of an offering, we are asking for **gently used children's books** which we will take to Crosslines on <u>July 24</u>. Please bring any donations you have to the church by that date. Additionally, the children will be selling crafts made at VBS each Sunday to raise money for the Global Ministries Caribbean Initiative.

**We welcome youth**, grades 6 and older who would like to be helpers. Please let Pastor Colleen or Karen Kemp know if you can help.

#### **VBS 2018 Mission Initiative**

This year the SJCC Planning Team in its desire to teach our children the importance of mission and outreach has chosen to support Global Ministries Caribbean Initiative projects. The proceeds from the VBS Craft Sale will help support this mission. Help our children be a blessing to others through their efforts. Below are but a few of the projects part of this Initiative that coincide with the countries they will visit.

**Columbia – CEDECOL Women's Network** is an interdenominational network of women working throughout Colombia as advocates for those affected by the violence.

**Dominican Republic - Caminante** meaning "One Who Walks the Path," serves children who are at risk of being drawn into prostitution as a result of the culture associated with the tourist economy in the Dominican Republic.

**Haiti - House of Hope** is a program for children laboring as domestic servants ("restaveks"), and also assists young moms, single girls, and elderly women who have been abandoned, by providing them with a safe place where they can learn social skills such as conflict resolution and a professional trade.

**Jamaica - Mount Olivet Boys Home** provides residential and social services for boys 8 - 18 years of age who are orphaned, abandoned, homeless, or reside with families who cannot adequately provide for their care. Also many children come to **Pringle Home** from situations of neglect and abuse, most having no family reference. The Pringle Home provides assistance for these abandoned, orphaned, and street children.

**Pastor Colleen:** excited to have Pastor Kathryn back; noted new church logo picture and explanation of meaning on website; disappointed with low attendance of Youth group - group will hold off on meetings/gatherings until Fall; seeking volunteers to hand out SJCC info during Downtown Diversity Pride Fest on July 14.

Pastor Kathryn: offered thanks to SJCC for having making her sabbatical possible and for "Welcome Back Luncheon"; explained that Committee members will continue work as they have been during her sabbatical leading themselves with Kathryn attending as ex-officio, freeing her to work on other aspects of Outreach; excited about work of One Joplin Initiative and being part of Human Services Team representing the faith community locally.

**CWF:** noted installation of Officers; explained, as part of year-end "spend down", they purchased 2 new lift chairs (evacuation chairs) with remainder of funds donated to Webb City Farmers Market WIC program.
