Festival of Sharing 2018

It seems like yesterday that we participated in the last Festival of Sharing event. This event has been revamped and this year we will travel a little closer to home. Mark your calendars for Saturday, October 20 at Hood United Methodist Church in Republic, MO. The event begins at 9 a.m. and we hope to have a good representation of volunteers from SJCC. Our project is the "*Missouri Readin*' & *Writin*' *Pack*.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION Sunday at 9:30 a.m. Room A-11

On Sunday mornings in September, we will be using DVD recordings from *"Living the Questions."* This curriculum is intended to stimulate thinking and inquiry, not convey absolutes. The first sessions will explore our approach to the Bible as a text, thinking theologically, and historical views of God's relationship with humanity. Each recording is approximately 40 minutes long, so we will need to begin on time at 9:30 a.m.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE AUGUST BOARD MEETING

Treasurer noted income slightly greater than expenses; raised concern regarding where funds would come from to pay expenses on Mission Station once Station fund is depleted; Board to appoint special committee to seek resolution.

Pastor Colleen noted Interfaith Planning Committee rescheduled Interfaith dinner in November to 2nd Saturday due to scheduling conflict; reminded committee chairs budget requests due before September Board meeting.

Pastor Kathryn announced she is still one person short for her Pastoral Relations Committee even with the addition of Chad Peterson-Sloan and Judy Akeman; she attended Crosslines meeting for first time in official capacity as member-at-large and working to get JOMO Restaurant Week back up and running; she will be out of office Aug. 25 (Anti-Racism/Pro-Reconciliation meeting), Sept. 8 (Regional Board), Sept. 17 (Southwest MO Disciples Women's Assembly) where she will be keynote speaker.

Faith Formation happy there had been 21 children registered for VBS and 7 were new to SJCC.

Green Team thankful to CWF for generous donation toward the Butterfly Garden and Darryl Coit/Mark Millard for help installing rain barrel; praised those on committee for continued hard work.

Outreach asked for volunteers to help at Crosslines sorting large donation from local Rhea Lana event.

Permanent Fund current balance of \$40,292.96 and anticipates 3% disbursement to SJCC from fund later this year.

Property informed Board sewer repair/replacement at 1910 S. Wall completed at cost of \$1,000; reported water bill (church building) of over \$400 (approx. \$320 more than usual) and worked with water company rep to determine cause was many toilets not functioning properly; ordered parts to repair the locks on north west basement door; order part for Pastor Colleen's office AC unit (previous trouble shoot and install of new part to cost approx. \$900.00); explained new light fixtures installed on park shelter (previous fixtures stolen).

Scholarship committee disbursed first installment of scholarship presented to Vance Halfaker; Elders received thank you from Vance and note of his intent to update monthly on his progress.

New Business: Board voted to approve request from Narcotics Anonymous to hold twice weekly meeting at SJCC (Monday and Tuesday) as group has outgrown current meeting place. Pastor Colleen informed Board the group will pay \$60/month for usage of the building with Board voting that any funds received be deposited into General Fund.
