#### **JANUARY BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

**Treasurer:** noted we ended month in the black; I&R showed net loss due to having to borrow from salary reserves to pay Dec. salaries and insurance premiums.

**Pastor Colleen:** report was included. It was noted we received notice from Church Extension that Investment Note maturity date been extended another three years; also noted we can reinvest, extend or redeem the Note.

Pastor Kathryn: continues to work on Youth Mission trip planned for June 2019 as well as working on general SJCC mission trip to Van Buren, MO scheduled for May 5-11, 2019 and pleased to announce 12 confirmed participants for general mission trip so far; continues to be part of upcoming JOMO Restaurant week benefiting Crosslines; will be one of the trainers at Anti-Racism/ Pro-Reconciling Justice Ministries Training scheduled January 25-26 at South Street Christian Church in Springfield; is working with One Joplin Human Services Team on Domestic Violence to develop a workshop for church leaders to be more cognizant of and find ways to deal with/decrease domestic violence; was excited to have had lunch with her Irving Elementary Lunch Pal.

**Outreach Financial**: noted KC Brockman very thankful for all volunteers who helped with Alternative Christmas Fair; Pastor Kathryn was pleased to announce total proceeds of fair and chili feed totaled \$859.18 and applauded SJCC congregation for generous donations to special Christmas offering.

**Elders:** raised \$500 and pleased to donate money to Crosslines.

**Memorial:** noted monies spent on Advent banners.

Outreach: said volunteers needed for Project Homeless Connect.

**Property:** voted to gift \$3,000 to SJCC as 15% (\$450) to General Operations, 15% (\$450) to Outreach, 35% (\$1,050) to Special Projects, and 35% (\$1,050) to Equipment Reserve; explained elevator works okay if load is centered (will continue to observe); noted some flooding in basement due to failed sump pump (replaced); offered thanks to Tom Hamm for mopping up after flooding; replaced nonworking shop vacuum; raised discussion regarding Boy Scout project currently being developed to enhance Friendship Park; informed Board locking mechanism installed on rear door of shuttle bus; still awaiting decision from Sheltered Workshop on whether or not they will accept our older green van as donation to the workshop.
