## MARCH BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

**Treasurer:** noted all February billing paid; encouraged Board members to review financial report prior to Board meeting.

Pastor Kathryn: pleased to announce Tom Hamm to act as construction manager for Adult Mission trip to VanBuren, MO; announced four young people registered for upcoming Youth Mission Trip (Rachel Eckhardt, Kayci Evans, Lexy Evans, and Laney Reaves); explained food pantry at MSSU being well used by approximately 25 students/month. The group hosting the food panty looks to Crosslines for advice on operations; pleased with One Joplin meeting with court staff, attorneys, and prosecutors to find ways to decrease domestic violence and child abuse in our area.

**Memorial:** Mark Millard informed Board of Memorial distribution of \$250 paid to Total Electronics to repair/replace a wireless microphone.

**Outreach:** announced SJCC's Week of Compassion special offering raised \$1,409.00; noted committee furnished lunch for teachers and staff at Irving Elementary; financial report included in packet. Pastor Kathryn explained last year's WoC offering of \$790 still in account not been sent - it will be sent with this year's offering.

**Permanent Fund:** motion to use funds from Permanent Fund annual distribution to purchase more bronze leaves for use on Tree of Life in the Narthex carried.

**Property:** noted heat/air in Pastor's office still not repaired; pleased with results of March 10 tornado drill; noted Joplin Sheltered Workshop thrilled to receive our 1995 van and plan to start janitorial service now that they have transportation; motion carried to authorize Total Electronics to switch alarm monitoring to digital system (\$376.00- to be paid out of Property Projects fund), noted this would increase monthly cost of monitoring by \$10; Midwest Concrete agreed to continue to repair steps (they previously repaired/resurfaced) as weather permits, at no cost.

**As an Aside:** Finger Labyrinths. Shari Cullumber noted knitting instructions on Disciple's website link inaccurate. She already contacted someone to let them know and hopefully the website link will be updated with the correct knitting instructions.
