

#### **Bright Futures - Irving Elementary School**

Can you believe that the new school year has started? Seems like just yesterday we were praying that our students enjoy a safe summer. So it is time for us to get geared up for another terrific year as one of Irving's faithful and energetic "faith-based" partners. The time, talent, and resources that SJCC provide to Irving definitely makes an impact on the lives of the students, teachers, and staff. Again this year, think about how you might be able to serve. Consider being a **Lunch P.A.L.** (Positive Adult Lunching with Students) which involves having lunch with an assigned student once a week for 20 minutes; or a **TREK Coach** (tutoring a student one hour weekly). Now is the time to contact Bright Futures and get signed up. New this year (beginning **September 16**) is the opportunity to pray on Monday mornings from 7:00 a.m. - 7:15 a.m. with other partners. #### 2019 FESTIVAL OF SHARING

The 2019 Festival of Sharing is just around the corner. Don't forget that we are still collecting Student Dental Packs and items for Backpacks of Love. **Donations of kits or money will be received through September 15.** Our goal is 30 Dental Packs and 20 Backpacks.

<u>Backpacks of Love</u> include the following items and should fit into a small backpack which will be provided by our Outreach Ministry: 1 T-shirt (child small, medium or large or adult); 1 small stuffed animal (no smaller than 6"); 1 child narrow tooth comb; 1 child soft toothbrush; 1 small tube child flavored toothpaste (6 oz. or larger); 1 pkg with 3 pair underpants; and 1 pair of socks. Please place all items for a complete kit in a zip lock bag. Make sure items are exactly as described above. Size of shirt, underwear and socks should match for either a girl or boy ages 4 -11.

<u>Student Dental Pack</u> includes 4 child sized soft toothbrushes (in original package); 2 adult soft toothbrushes (in original package); 1 dental floss (any size); and 1 fluoride toothpaste (6 oz. or more). Please place all items for a complete kit in a one gallon zipped lock bag. Make sure items are exactly as described above.

<u>Place completed kit for either the Backpacks of Love or the Student Dental Pack in the totes located in the Narthex or Fellowship Hall.</u> All of the kits will be received at the Festival of Sharing on Saturday, September 21 at Hood United Methodist Church (Republic, MO) and distributed to families in Missouri.

**Pastor Colleen:** results of "Church Check-up" show concern over financial stability, aging facilities, communication gaps, and opportunities for faith development - will seek discernment/direction of leadership determining how to deal with concerns; Jessica Fletcher Fierro to manage outdoor "free" library; Vance Halfaker made decision to pursue ordination through Episcopal church.

**Pastor Kathryn:** received call from Catholic Charities asking for group of volunteers to finish a small job on a home damaged by 2017 flooding in Neosho.

**CWF:** group will begin making apple pies in September.

**Faith Formation:** pleased with VBS turnout and expressed gratitude to all who gave time or donated food and supplies.

**Green Team:** caterpillars now appearing in Butterfly Garden; thankful for donations to Garden.

**Hospitality:** money coming in for dinners doesn't quite cover cost of meals; pleased with number of folks showing up for Wednesday evening meal (40-50 each week); estimated weekly costs approximately \$100.

Memorial: The financial report was included in our packets. Mark Millard noted an expenditure of \$33.97 for the purchase of study books. The purchase was paid out of the Library fund.

Outreach: Joplin Bungalow Project (community's 1st permanent housing for seniors and homeless veterans) seeking donations of furniture; they are continuing to work on Backpacks and Dental Packs for Festival of Sharing; continues to work with One Joplin on housing code enforcement; asked for volunteers to help with manning the SJCC booth during Pridefest, as well as volunteers to mingle with the crowd.

**Worship:** needing volunteers for CW&W greeter and has paid position opening for nursery attendant.

**Youth:** Lemonade Stand fundraiser raised \$370 to be split between Crosslines and the MSSU Lion's Co-Op.

As an aside: banner promoting new logo has arrived.

**Personnel Committee:** motion carried to hire Spencer Dawson as Music Leadership Team Choir Director.
