From Our Senior Minister, Rev. Dr. Colleen Carroll

Recently a few of us from the SJCC Book Club were able to travel to hear author Diana Butler Bass speak in Tulsa. Her topic was gratitude, and her lecture was entitled, "What's Gratitude Got to Do with It?" Since the book we have been reading is on the topic of the decline of mainline churches, some of us were a bit skeptical about the relativity of her chosen topic. Speaking for myself, I was pleasantly surprised!



Far from the warm, emotional response we associate with gratitude, Dr. Bass exploded a bombshell in my mind! Briefly, she researched the Roman Empire's socio-political and economic culture of *gratus* (the Latin root for gratitude) which shaped the world in Jesus' time, showing it to be a *quid pro quo* system that buried the peasant classes in debt, and identified Jesus' message of a kin-dom of grace to be the direct opposite. For the ancient Roman Empire, *gratus* was a system of benefaction with strings attached, continually spiraling the peasant classes into further indebtedness. But Jesus advocated an economy of grace where every day is a day of Jubilee free from debt – a move from a pyramid scheme to a round table with equal seats of honor. As we prioritize our ministries at SJCC, once more I rejoice in the commitment to welcome all people, without regard to social or economic status and all other common categories that society at large uses to favor some and ignore others. Only through such an inclusive approach can we begin to dismantle the false narrative of scarcity and prejudice and live out the gospel of grace and abundance.

November signals a season of gratitude and thanksgiving in North American culture and churches, and I rejoice in the opportunity to be reminded of the roots of gratitude, and to give God thanks for the free gift of grace, embodied in the person of Jesus and emulated in this faithful congregation I am honored to pastor.

October 8, 2019 Board Meeting Highlights

Treasurer: welcomed, and offered thanks to, Kim Noll for agreeing to accept role of Assistant Treasurer; remarked on month looking positive financially with five Sundays in Sept.; explained receipts of \$4,477.50 (included the \$5,500 note cashed) over and above monies needed for payment of IRS penalties to be reinvested.

Pastor Colleen: received many thanks from musical group, "The Collection", for opportunity to play in SJCC noting the group was impressed with SJCC's welcoming attitude; pleased with questions received during sessions regarding resolutions from General Assembly and with number of folks responding to question of members favorite church seasons; noted she and Pastor Kathryn attending "Cane Ridge Re-Vital" with Pastor Kathryn sharing a presentation on SJCC's Risk Taking mission.

Pastor Kathryn: attended Persons In Ministry Retreat noting she obtained very good information on using story telling in ministry; announced Tea Conversations event successful with 35 attending. She and Pastor Colleen appreciate SJCC folks participating; pleased to announce she is again meeting with her "Lunch Pal" at Irving Elementary and urged others to volunteer for this important ministry; excited to note One Joplin, Catholic Charities, Joplin Area Habitat, et al, held groundbreaking of start of a new "micro house" duplex project; thanked everyone for thoughts, support, and prayers as she dealt with a death in the family.

Green Team: began work on second Butterfly Garden.

Permanent Fund: disbursement check of \$1,884.91 received and designated as follows: 60% Property Projects; 30% Outreach; 10% General Fund.

Property: noted AC unit (1906 Wall) repaired - awaiting final bill. committee will take on project of sealing front steps of the church themselves which should save approximately \$700; church sign at 20th/Wall damaged in traffic accident and committee awaiting police report in order to seek repairs from insurance company; Safety Team considering seeking training on how to handle issues with guests who need to be escorted from premises. Pastor Kathryn reminded all that we need to be vigilant about locking doors and turning off the elevator when no one is present in the building as this is a continuing issue.

New Business: motion passed to amend the April 2019 Minutes, under New Business to read, ...*form a Finance Committee consisting of the Board Chair (as Chair of the Finance Committee), Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Assistant Financial Secretary, and present Clergy.*
