

October Is Stewardship Month

Inspired by a devotional in Robert Schnase's devotional, Practicing Extravagant Generosity, the theme for our annual stewardship emphasis will be "Seeds With Wings." Watch for a letter in your mailbox and begin thinking about your estimate of generosity for the ministries we share at SJCC. We will celebrate the harvest of generosity on Sunday, October 27 during our morning worship.

Crayola ColorCycle Program

Did you know colored markers can be recycled? Crayola recently introduced a recycling program for schools and here are a few interesting facts: (A) One box of eight recycled markers creates enough energy to prepare a breakfast that consists of brewing a pot of coffee, frying an egg and making two pieces of toast. (B) 308 markers produces 1 gallon of fuel, which is enough to power an SUV (consider 15MPG) for 15 miles. (C) If a classroom recycles 193 markers, that is enough to move a city bus (5 mpg) for three miles. Joplin North teacher Jessica Fletcher-Fierro has offered to include SJCC in her classroom project. Crayola ColorCycle will accept all brands of plastic markers, not just Crayola markers, including dry erase markers and highlighters. A collection bin is located in Fellowship Hall next to the aluminum and plastic recycling bins for your donations. Thank you, Jessica!

Treasurer: noted donations toward IRS penalty payoff not all reflected as additional funds came in during September.

Pastor Colleen: reported on new Wednesday evening abbreviated worship; informed Board of start of new Book Club discussion; noted upcoming: Tea & Conversations (Sept. 19), Interfaith Panel (Oct. 5), Regional leadership event (Oct. 19); reminded committee chairs to get budget request to Shari Cullumber ASAP.

Pastor Kathryn: thanked everyone for opportunity to preach Sept. 9; will represent Christian faith at Interfaith Panel; invited to perform blessing of Irving Elementary classrooms; announced bunk beds from Quonset hut donated to Souls Harbor; agreed to serve as mentor for ordination candidate (Mid-Am Region); noted One Joplin looking for 20 volunteers as literacy tutors; explained Habitat for Humanity seeking candidates for Brush with Kindness program;

Outreach: announced Raquel Sapien, Betsy Wheeler, Donna Fuller, Julia Foster, and Patt Hinds attending Festival of Sharing; shared information flyers regarding Joplin Bungalow Project (community's 1st permanent housing for seniors and homeless veterans) and asked members to consider what SJCC can do to help with this project.

Property: working to track down water leaks in building; replaced "guts" on 5 toilets; replaced sump pump float in elevator pit and found; TEC replaced non working motion detector; received bid of \$1,650 to repair cracked heat exchanger in furnace at 1906 Wall; noted water meter removed from The Station.

New Business: motion passed to instate Kimberly Noll as Assistant Treasurer through 2019; motion passed to remove Sherry Elliott and designate Colleen Carroll as "Responsible Party" as listed on IRS form 8822_B;

Old Business: Pastor Kathryn mailed checks (\$3,968.16 and \$4,019.40) to IRS to pay penalties for alleged late sending of paperwork; plus two deposits made to IRS accounts (\$400 ea); funds totaling \$12,145.06 received toward resolving IRS issue (\$5,305 CD + \$6,840.06 donations); \$4,277.50 to be reinvested; noted although penalties paid, efforts continue to have penalties abated. Appeal must be filed within 60 days from Aug. 19, 2019.
