

"Repeat the Sounding Joy!"

The well-known classic carol, "Joy to the World" turns 300 years old this Christmas, and we're celebrating the occasion by utilizing one of the four verses each week during Advent in our morning worship. The lyrics surprisingly compliment the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, and provide a familiar refrain for the Advent Candle lighting. Here is a synopsis to whet your appetite:

Week 1/Dec. 1: Hope – Prepare Him Room – Isaiah 30:19-6 Week 2/Dec. 8: Peace – Make Nations Prove – Luke 1:46-55 Week 3/Dec. 15: Joy – Repeat the Sounding Joy – Luke 1:67-79 Week 4/Dec. 22: Love – Make Blessings Flow – Matthew 1:18-25

Additionally, in response to questions posed to individuals in the congregation who indicated that Advent and Christmas were their favorite times of the church year, I have made a concerted effort to include almost all of the Christmas carols from our hymnal in worship at least once during December through Epiphany Sunday, since traditional music appears to be at the top of the "must have" list!

Another response I heard about what makes this season so special was shared intergenerational opportunities. So we will be combining the youth and adults during the month of December for the Sunday School hour to compare and discuss the nativity story in the Gospel of Luke with the Charlie Brown Christmas (another nostalgic Christmas favorite!). We will meet in room A-12 to take advantage of the TV screen to watch clips from the show to accompany our discussion.

Your presence and support at these events is welcomed and appreciated, and will definitely enhance your holiday enjoyment. We will do our best to inform the congregation as we hear of other performances past the deadline for this publication. Finally, let me express my profound Joy in the opportunity to serve South Joplin Christian Church as pastor. 4. **Motion passed** to approve 2020 budget for congregational vote with stipulation that, due to anticipated income shortfall, a special committee be appointed to review income and expense options and present to the congregation a report of said review in three (3) months.
