#### **December 10, 2019 Board Meeting Highlights**

**Treasurer:** continues to hold overage monies raised for payment of IRS penalties until IRS issues final determination.

**Senior Minister:** noted breakdown of salary per IRS regulations; pleased to note Joplin Interfaith Coalition rec'd \$2,000 gift from Joplin Christian Scientist church - group will use funds to move forward with organizing as 501c.3 entity.

Minister of Mission and Outreach: expressed gratitude for having a congregation that gives her the opportunity to be able to preach at SJCC and to outside congregations; working with Joplin Chamber of Commerce Inclusion and Diversity Workgroup on proclamation stating that Joplin will not tolerate discrimination in any form; continues to work with ordination candidate.

**Elders:** Officers for 2020: Mark Millard, chair; Leanna Carrol, secretary; Darlene Coit, Board rep.

**Hospitality:** seeking more donations to help offset costs of food, as well as kitchen supplies.

Personnel: motion carried to hire Sara Faucett as Nursery Attendant; announced Spencer Dawson resigning as Choir Director effective December 22, 2019 and Sherry Elliott resigning as Church Secretary, December 31, 2019.

**Property:** no progress by City of Joplin on pothole repair in alley behind the church or paper/cardboard dumpsters; elevator continues to give trouble periodically with water in shaft being a problem - sump pump needs constant monitoring to ensure proper operation and motor that opens east door failed last Friday and should be replaced soon; security alarm sounded during the night as motion detector in sanctuary tripped due to decoration covering the unit; tenant at 1906 Wall moving at end of December; Sara Faucett renting 1910 Wall as of December 6; pleased with response of Safety Team (and other church members) to a medical situation during the worship on December 8.
