I belong to a Facebook group called "Things They Didn't Teach Us in Seminary." Members are restricted to clergy, and it's generally a site for mutual support and idea sharing.

The changes brought about by the COVID - 19 crisis definitely gualify as one of those topics I was not instructed about in seminary! No one ever taught a class on what to do if you had to shut down church for up to eight weeks and maintain "social distance," especially at the height of the Lent and Easter seasons. But one of my professors did like the answer to almost every question with the response, "Ministry is messy." Thank you, Peggy Way.

I'm at a loss on what to write in this space. I can't say for sure that we will be able to gather for worship in April, or what the plans will be if we either do or do not meet. If we are still under cancelation recommendations, we will continue some options for online meditations and possibly some small outdoor gatherings if the weather is cooperative. Our choir will not be able to rehearse, but our organist, Chris Greninger, will surely not disappoint with appropriate worship music if we are able to worship together. We will make due with whatever the circumstances allow.

I am reminded of the timely verse from Luke's gospel which takes place during Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a colt. Some Pharisees were annoyed at the noise of the crowd, and told Jesus to silence his disciples. Jesus responded, "/ tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." (Luke 19:39-40)

Spring is coming, pandemic or not. The birds are still returning and building nests; flowers are blooming and trees are budding. The cancelation of worship - even on Easter - cannot erase the testimony that God loves the world, including the world of nature. If we are able to resume corporate worship in time for Easter, I will rejoice. If we must postpone or make alternative plans, I will still rejoice. Resurrection is about the triumph of grace over the grave, and COVID - 19 cannot and will not change that truth. A year from now as we look back on this season, may we marvel at the miraculous ways hope rises from the earth and from the heart, transforming a dreary outlook into the brightest of possibilities. We, here in Joplin, are experienced in such hopeful endeavors, are we not?


Diversity and Inclusion Proclamation



By now you should have received your invitation to complete the 2020 Census. It is easy to complete, fairly short and we are counting on you. Each decade there are various groups in our communities that are under counted which influences funding for community services such as hospitals, schools, assistance programs, medicare, senior centers, congressional seats, etc. for the next 10 years. SJCC has been designated as a community hub. However, due to the COVID-19 outbreak the dates for hub site operations are being re-determined. If you have general questions or need assistance you may contact Pastor Kathryn at the church (417-624-2522) for guidance.

Go2Hours

Where and how are you serving others along your journey of faith and service? In completing our Annual Yearbook Report one of the questions asked for data reflecting how our congregation serves in our local community and beyond. It was a little difficult compiling the information since folks stopped completing Go2Hours forms during the past two years. Tracking this data is how we are able to help tell the story of the outpouring of generosity from our congregation in the community and beyond. How and where are we making a difference in the lives of others. We need to tell our story. In February during a Mission Challenge the Go2Hours process was reintroduced, and we need you to complete a form documenting your hours and places of service whether church sponsored or done individually. Help us tell our story of witness through service by weekly or monthly indicating where you have served, number of hours, and how many were impacted by your service. You can find the GO2HOURS form/slip in the pew pockets. Once filled out just drop it in the offering plate or slide under Pastor Kathryn's door.

Due to the current COVID - 19 pandemic Crosslines has made changes in its operations. Therefore it is uncertain whether our Volunteer Team will serve the 4th Thursday in April.

Please visit the Crosslines website for the latest announcement and details regarding hours and days of operation. Their building will no longer be open to the public. Currently Crosslines is not accepting any type of food, clothing, household or other such donations. However, they are asking for financial donations at this time which will enable the purchase of larger quantities of food from the Ozark Food Harvest. Clients will only be able to receive food or rental assistance as of March 23. All requests must be made online or via phone 24 hours in advance and all orders will be pre-bagged prior to arrival for pickup. As things change we will keep you posted. In brief, Crosslines will be open to disburse food only on Monday (4 pm-6:30 pm), Wednesday (10 am-1:30 pm) and Friday (10 am-1:30 pm). They will not be distributing food on Tuesday or Thursday; those will be the days when they will pre-package pantry boxes/commodities and process orders.
