I also thank my special helpers <u>Adam</u> <u>Hajeh</u>, <u>Autumn VanVolkinburg</u>, and <u>Chris Greninger</u> whom I roped into helping me sing our VBS song on a Sunday morning after we recorded the church service. Since we did not meet in person, we didn't have the opportunity to enjoy the tasty snacks and meals provided by our usual kitchen crew, but hopefully some families tried the recipes which were provided. I also thank each of the parents, grandparents, and especially the <u>children</u> who joined, making the experience so worthwhile.

The good news is that each of the videos for the four weeks will remain on our church YouTube channel, so if you subscribe to our channel, you can watch them anytime. The children's book which Darlene read will also become part of our children's library, so you can borrow them for your kids.

Finally, please note that the mission project is something we can all support, whether or not you participated in VBS. Through Global Ministries, we have an opportunity to make our VBS a blessing to our partners in India. See Pastor Kathryn's article to see how you can help.

We hope and pray in advance that next year we won't have to be online again, but thanks be to God for all the lessons learned and the blessings realized.

VBS 2020 Mission Project

Our 2020 Vacation Bible School took us on "A Journey to India" where we were able to hear about the partnerships and work being supported in India through the Disciples Global Ministries. The children were able to spend time with me each week hearing about four special projects: Week #1 - The Tibetan Children's Village; Week #2 - Family Farm Village and King's Matriculation School; Week #3 - Deep Griha Society, Pune; and Week #4 - Evangelical Mission Hospital - Khariar and Children's Home. So now that we have finished our journey we pause to reflect on the impact these projects have had on the lives of both children and adults in India. Visit our church YouTube channel and listen and learn about this great work. As always our VBS mission component involves a project. This year in collaboration with Global Ministries "Child and Elder Sponsorship Program" we are inviting anyone in the congregation interested to join us in our effort to sponsor a child/children for one year. The VBS participants will vote on one of the four projects for the sponsorship. The average cost is \$25 - \$35 per month but you may contribute any amount, even as little as \$5.00. IRVING PARTNERSHIP AND BRIGHT FUTURES



Reopening

Due to rising cases of COVID 19 in the area, reopening of the church has been postponed. A task force has been named to begin reviewing protocols and procedures for the eventual reopening, with Judy Akeman as the chair person.

The General Minister and President of our denomination, Rev. Terri Hord Owens, offers this insight:

"The phased opening plans developed by public health experts call for several benchmarks to indicate safety such as 14 days of declining case counts, widespread testing, and contact tracing. We are not there yet.

The economic impact of this pandemic is devastating...and many of the decisions to reopen business are in response (to that economic impact).

Church, we don't make decisions based on economics. We make decisions based on love. And here in this time, in the midst of this pandemic, the loving thing to do is not to gather for worship. Love, as we know from 1 Corinthians 13:4-5, is patient. Love does not insist on its own way."
