Advent Worship—Do Not Be Afraid!

Our theme and material for Advent worship this year comes from Illustrated Ministry. Each week we will email a small packet of pages which include scriptures and inspirational material, small illustrations, and an



additional coloring page which, when colored and pieced together at the end of the fourth week will form a stained-glass mosaic poster. The scripture text and theme for Sunday worship will come from the material, so our worship and your devotions at home will coincide. The weekly themes and scriptures are as follows:

November 29—Do not be afraid to hold HOPE: Luke 1:26-45 December 6—Do not be afraid to bring PEACE: Luke 1:46-55 December 13—Do not be afraid to practice JOY: Luke 2:1-14 December 20—Do not be afraid to choose LOVE: Luke 2:15-20

For those who will be lighting Advent wreaths weekly at home, there are several suggestions:

- * You might have supplies ready to light your wreath simultaneously with our Sunday morning worship service.
- * You might choose to watch the Children Worship and Wonder weekly session and light your wreath together with the storyteller.
- * You might print and use the litany from the weekly bulletin and assign reading parts to your family members.
- * Of course you are free to use your own devotional material.

This is all very new for us, but we hope there will be something of inspirational value for all ages and stages along the faith journey. Nothing would make us happier than seeing your colorful responses or hearing your thoughtful reflections to the weekly questions, so please feel free to post to your Facebook page and tag South Joplin Christian Church, or email the church so we can share your responses. 
