**January 2020:** What is Carbon Neutrality?

This year, the Green Team will primarily focus on reaching the goal of being carbon neutral by 2030. For an organization to be carbon neutral, they: 1) calculate their carbon emissions 2) work on lowering them, and 3) purchase carbon offsets (invest in climate change mitigating projects) for the emissions they cannot eliminate. Look for more ways to support these efforts in the months to come!

**Green tip:** Lower your carbon footprint at home by setting your refrigerator and freezer correctly. The United States Department of Energy recommends around 35 to 38 degrees Fahrenheit for the fridge and 0 degrees for freezers. (And unplug that old fridge in the garage when you don't need it to

Meeting via Zoom on December 8, the board received the report of mail-in ballots counted from the November election as follows: 37 household ballots received with 56 individual voters. Budget received 54 yes votes, 1 no vote, and 1 abstention. Leadership nominations received 56 yes votes and 0 no votes. Additionally, the board approved a motion to appoint a Tech Team to give oversight to our changing technological needs. The team will be appointed by the executive committee.
