"BEAUTY FOR ASHES"

We take our theme for Lent this year from the Book of Isaiah, chapter 61, verse three in particular: *"and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair."* (NIV)

By the time the season of Lent concludes, we will have spent one full year in the "exile" of the COVID-19 pandemic that has driven almost all of our congregational activities online or halted them entirely. We have been in exile away from our building and fellowship, and we are weary. We are ready for hopeful prophecy.

In some bibles Isaiah 61 is subtitled "The Good News of Deliverance," and its words paint a picture of good news indeed. But before we skip to deliverance or return, we will embrace the opportunity the season affords to make peace with the journey of exile, and to find our God-iverse ever near, even in the ashes. Our weekly texts will follow the Revised Common Lectionary leading up to Easter Sunday, including passages from the gospels of Mark and John.

Each Monday evening Pastor Colleen will host a discussion of the text via Zoom at 6:30PM and include a brief meditative exercise and prayer. These sessions will begin on February 22 and continue through March 29. The link will be sent via email to those on our contact list and remain the same throughout the six weeks.

Additionally, the Worship Ministry Team and Pastor Kathryn are putting together a Lenten Calendar with daily activities to guide our reflection and action throughout the season. These will be mailed along with an Ash Wednesday prayer card prior to the beginning of Lent. A brief meditation will also be conducted on our church Facebook page at 10AM on Ash Wednesday and available for viewing throughout the day at your convenience.

You are invited to ready yourself for this season by opening your eyes to the ways God is constantly transforming the world around us from decay into growth, from death into resurrection, from ashes to beauty.

From the Tech Team

The SJCC tech team's first priority is to make our online worship experiences better. We appreciate your patience. Our latest updates:

Online worship: With improved uploaded capabilities with a new modem and improved service, we are more confident in our ability to both livestream Sunday morning worship on Facebook, and have the service available afterward on the church's YouTube channel. We continue to fine tune our video efforts, recognizing that many of you would like to see close-up of faces. Audio transmission remains a work in progress. We have added some new equipment to the computer that will help us more proactively respond to audio issues; please be patient as this also is requiring our sound technicians to learn new skills and strategies. We continue to work toward getting the appropriate balance of voices and music.

Equipment inventory: We are compiling an equipment list, as well as their ages, as we try to keep somewhat current. This inventory, along with the new equipment in the sound booth, shows we have not stayed close to current on some of our software packages. We have been forced to upgrade our MediaShout worship software equipment, and will be upgrading our ChurchPro accounting and membership software very soon.

Souper Bowl of Caring 2021

2020 proved to be an unprecedented year for families unable to provide adequate food for their families as the result of the COVID-19 pandemic. That is why our contribution to the Souper Bowl of Caring is even more important this year. SJCC has participated in this event for many, many years to support our partner Crosslines Ministries as they continue to address food insecurity in our local community. SJCC kicked off its Souper Bowl Campaign on Sunday January 10th. The campaign will conclude on **Souper Bowl Sunday, February 7**. Because of the pandemic we are not collecting can goods and non-perishable food items but are asking for monetary donations. For every dollar raised through your donations our Outreach Ministry will match it dollar for dollar up to \$500. 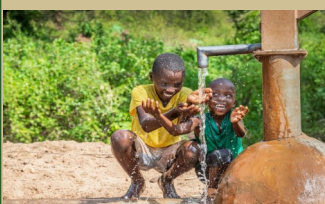
Thanks to your generous giving to our Christmas Offering in 2020 we received \$625 to support regional ministries.

February 2021: Calculating Our Carbon Footprint

This month the Green Team began calculating our gas and electric use/emissions at the church in order to calculate our carbon footprint. We hope to have a report in next month's newsletter. Are you interested in calculating your household's carbon footprint? Grab your utility bills (or log in to your online account) and try out this calculator: <https://www3.epa.gov/carbon-footprint-calculator/>. You can use your dollar amount to estimate your carbon usage, making it simple to see how you're doing! You can even compare your use to the US average for your family size (and try to beat it if you're the competitive type!)

Green Tip:

Speaking of utility bills, look into switching to "e-billing." In the United States, paper products make up the largest percentage of municipal solid waste, and hard copy bills alone generate almost 2 million tons of CO2. Save paper by signing up for e-billing.
