#### From Our Senior Minister



It's really hard to see. You have to squint and look hard at the top of the stump. Can you see it—the shape of a heart burned through the bark? I didn't see it until after I'd already taken several photographs of this stump that sits atop one of our burn piles at the lot where we're building our new home. The shape and character of this stump changes each time we light the fire, and has become somewhat of an old friend to me in the process.

Ideally, this stump would be the centerpiece in our sanctuary for the duration of Lent, reminding us each time we gather to look for beauty among the ashes of our faith journey, transformed as it has been this last year by COVID.

This stump also serves as a reminder of God's ongoing activity of regeneration in the world and in our lives. The tree that once grew strong and tall from the ground began as a small seed, pushing its way through the rocks and dirt until there was nothing left of the seed from which it sprang. As Jesus reminds his disciples in John 20:24, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." Even as the seed once died, so now the tree also dwindles into a mere shadow of its former glory, all the while returning nutrients into the ground which will undoubtedly harbor new growth.

What are the "stumps" that remain as signposts in your life, reminding you of the times you have had to clear the ground to make a new pathway or build a new future? Can you appreciate their beauty and sacrifice? What do you need to let go of in order to reach another new goal? What seeds of possibility might be gestating under the surface of your heart as you await the coming spring?

In the remaining weeks of Lent we will wait and reflect together on the mystery of God's power to bring hope from despair and strength from weakness, and rejoice together finally in the triumph of resurrection and new life even after crucifixion. May God grant us the vision to see beauty and bounty even in these days of preparation and pandemic, making room for all things new.

### "Holy Conversations" Regional Lenten Council Circles

Join your fellow Mid-America Disciples every Thursday in Lent. These will be uniquely-structured Zoom gatherings (accessible by computer or phone) to draw upon deep, holy themes facing us in these challenging times. This Season of Lent provides an outlet for naming and sharing deep thoughts and emotions of what we and our churches have experienced in this year-long pandemic, and other resulting pains from isolation, division, and strife. The first theme explored through scripture, poetry, and individual sharing on Feb. 18 and revolve around the 2021 Regional theme of **The Healing Power of Jesus**.

"Holy Conversations" is a different sort of time together using the ancient traditions of Council. This spiritual **practice** receives inspiration from sacred sharing at the gathering of the twelve tribes of Israel (Joshua 4:24) and universal practices by God's people across the spectrums of time and place. **Holy Conversations are not**: a discussion group, a place to debate ideas, a place to receive or give answers or advice, or a place to be held accountable by others. Council is a place **uncommon** to the rest of life where you are invited to **put down** the many identities and roles you play, reconnect to life itself and sink deeper into your **true self**. A large part of our practice of Council is telling our own **stories**, hearing ourselves speak in the **presence** of others. When we are touched, moved, and inspired by the Holy Spirit in **Holy Conversation**, **something new** is created in us that anchors these primal teachings in the personal realm of direct experience. The primary motivation for these weekly Lenten rituals is **inner work** that expands the depth and breadth of love in Jesus Christ, ourselves, and other people. Breakout rooms are used for smaller circle groups of participants to enable full and accessible participation by all who join. **"Holy Conversations**" may be accessed weekly through invitation by Paul Koch. From the Tech Team Thanks to Michael Soderstrom for doing some maintenance work on the church computers! We're continuing to fine-tune our online worship experience. We have discovered an issue with our camera that requires it to shut down if on video after 29 minutes, 59 seconds. There is no long-term solution; while we continue to determine other specific needs, be patient as we expect a short interruption in the streamline service before the sermon. We're happy to have both online services totally functional again. The upgrade to ChurchPro, our financial and membership database system, is now complete and operational.
