Picking Up the Pace

May is the month when we begin the cautious but long-awaited resumption of worship in our building. The elders are in consensus that it is time to worship in-person on a weekly basis with only a few changes from what we traditionally have done.

We will:

Attempt to socially distance people in the pews
Sing, pray, light candles, and participate in Communion (without elements)
Enjoy special music from handbells or soloists and ensembles
Provide clip-board pages for elementary children
Record the service and provide online options for viewing

We will not:

Share refreshments or Sunday School before the service Require masks (although the CDC still recommends indoor use) Resume the choir, nursery, or Children Worship and Wonder (for the time being) Have Communion elements or pass the offering plates
