Name Change Recommendation

A task force consisting of Megan Bever (chair), Clayton Bowman, James Knudston, Terry Plossl, and Daniell Sanders with Pastor Colleen as ex-officio put forth a recommendation to the church board last week for a new name for the church.

In their report, the group considered a name that:

reflects the values and priorities of the congregation;

provides continuity with our current acronym and logo so that we are recognizable;

is not tied to a location, such as "Joplin" or "south";

does not contain known associations that are opposed to our values.

The task force recommended and the board approved the name **Sojourners Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)**. Upon board discussion, it was further recommended that the "J" in SoJourners be capitalized to maintain a visual continuity to SJCC, especially in graphic depictions included with our current logo.

The task force report explained that, "a sojourner is one who lives temporarily, possibly as a stranger, in a place. It reminds us that we are temporary stewards and members of our community while also welcoming others who join us as we all journey through life. The name specifically includes as a part of our congregation people who may feel as if they are sojourning (read: are strangers) in Jasper County due to marginalization. It also reminds us that on our faith journey as well, we move through different stages."

Helpful scripture references to sojourners are found in Job 31:32, Psalm 39:12, Psalm 146:9, and Hebrews 11:9. Known association with the word in American culture include Sojourners Magazine (a progressive Christian publication); Sojourner Truth (a 19th century abolitionist and feminist); Sojourner Project (a Minnesota-based shelter for victims of domestic abuse); SoJourner Bags.

The adoption of this recommended name change will be voted on at the annual congregational meeting to be held in November. Deep appreciation to the members of the task force for their faithful and insightful recommendation for our pathway forward together.

2023 Stewardship Emphasis "Dayenu"

In Hebrew, the word "Dayenu" means "it would have been enough." The word is used prominently in the Passover recitation of the deliverance of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt as a repeated refrain, recalling each act of God in the Exodus story. Each refrain states an act of God and recites that it would have been enough, but God went on to do even more. This way of telling the story magnifies the grace of God and the gratitude of the people in worship.

We will be using the concept of Dayenu in personal testimony and in worship during our fall stewardship emphasis on October 8, 15, and 22. October 22 will be Commitment Sunday when SJCC participants will be invited to turn in Estimate of Giving cards for 2024 to assist our financial considerations for the coming year. Letters and estimate cards will be mailed the first week of October. Extra copies of the letter and card will be available at PLC for those who we may miss in the mailing.

We invite you to make a list or timeline of all the ways or occasions God has blessed you and our congregation and give thanks for God's compounding and abounding provision and grace. 
SJCC contributed 55 cans of pasta products for Crosslines in September – Thank you!
