
WELCOMING AND ACCEPTING ALL PEOPLE ALONG A JOURNEY OF FAITH AND SERVICE.

Faith Formation

Faith Formation has been exploring having a Faith Formation class at the same time as adult worship time instead of children's Sunday School at 9:30. On Sundays when we have Worship and Wonder, the <u>Faith Formation class would be for children in grades three through five</u>. On Sundays when there is no Worship and Wonder, the <u>class would be for ages three through fifth grade</u>. Children would remain with their parents in adult worship for the opening songs and prayers, leaving for the Faith Formation class after the choir anthem or after communion if communion is switched to precede the sermon. Because Peace Lutheran uses the room we use for Sunday School one Sunday each month, on that Sunday, children would remain in adult worship.

We have met with parents to explain that for this plan to work, we would need extra helpers/teachers. We received a positive response to this, but we would still need extra adults to volunteer probably once every two months. There are actually four needed positions: Storyteller and Greeter in Worship and Wonder, Teacher and Helper in Faith Formation. The Storyteller and Greeter positions require the most training. The material we are using for Faith Formation would be available for pre-study for the Teacher. The Helper would only need to be present without any previous preparation. Our Congregation has long been committed to ensuring our children know the Bible stories that are the foundation of our faith. If you can see your way clear to helping us fulfil that commitment in any of these positions, please speak to Karen Kemp (417-438-2384) or Darlene Coit (417-540-2750.)

• Watch the video to create your own version of the poster, or, to recreate it outside using sidewalk chalk;


